

Postgraduate Dissertations in Practical Theology

A new opportunity for postgraduate students to disseminate research.

Through the website of our publishers, Equinox, *Practical Theology* is now offering a free service that allows postgraduate students to advertise the abstract of their Masters or Doctoral dissertation online.

The benefit to you is that you can get your work noticed and gain a higher profile in the academic and practitioner spheres. You can raise your chances of potentially interested parties finding your work and then either sourcing it as a whole or contacting you to discuss the material. This publicly available and searchable online database also demonstrates the diversity of work being undertaken at postgraduate level in the discipline of practical theology.

The process is very simple and will be familiar to anyone who has already uploaded details of their work onto their university's digital repository. It only takes a few minutes and the details of the work are then available for anyone to see.

You need only click on the following link,

to find yourself on the *Practical Theology* 'Dissertation Abstracts' page. The following pages lead you through the process of entering your abstract and other information. It is all highly intuitive and each section can contain as little or as much as you wish to submit. (Before your entry goes live on the website, a member of the editorial team will confirm its authenticity with your named supervisor).

The term 'practical theology' will be interpreted very broadly, the only stipulation is that your dissertation must have been awarded at least a pass mark by your institution. This service is available for successfully completed dissertations (at postgraduate Masters or Doctoral levels) only.
